## **DONLAN JOINS DAVID LAWRENCE FOUNDATION BOARD OF TRUSTEES**

**NAPLES, FL.,** August 25, 2010 – The David Lawrence Foundation, a community-based, not-for-profit organization established to support the mission, operations and growth of the David Lawrence Center, announced the appointment of Jack Donlan to its Board of Trustees.

A resident of Naples, Donlan has had an extensive career in negotiations and mediation. Since 1993, he has worked with the National Football League (NFL) Pension Board on a variety of special projects. Before that, he was the Executive Director of the NFL Management Council.

Earlier in his career, Donlan served as Vice President of Industrial Relations (now called Human Resources) for National Airlines and as a Federal Mediation and Conciliation Services Commissioner. Concurrently with these positions, he taught at the Georgetown University School of Law and at the University of Miami School of Law. He also previously served three years in the U.S. Army. Donlan received his undergraduate and Law degrees from Boston University and his Master's in Law degree from New York University.

Established in 1976, the David Lawrence Foundation raises funds to support the programs and services of the David Lawrence Center, a community mental health center that provides affordable mental health and substance abuse services in Southwest Florida. In addition to helping children with behavioral, emotional and substance abuse challenges, the Center provides counseling and rehabilitative services to adults in crisis and individuals with persistent mental illness. The David Lawrence Center has eight locations in Collier County and touches the lives of over 20,000 clients a year. Its mission is to restore and rebuild the lives of all of those in need.
